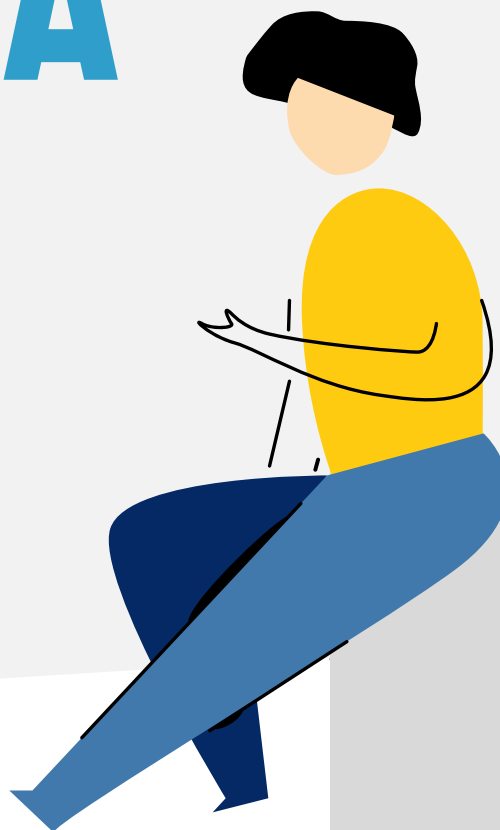

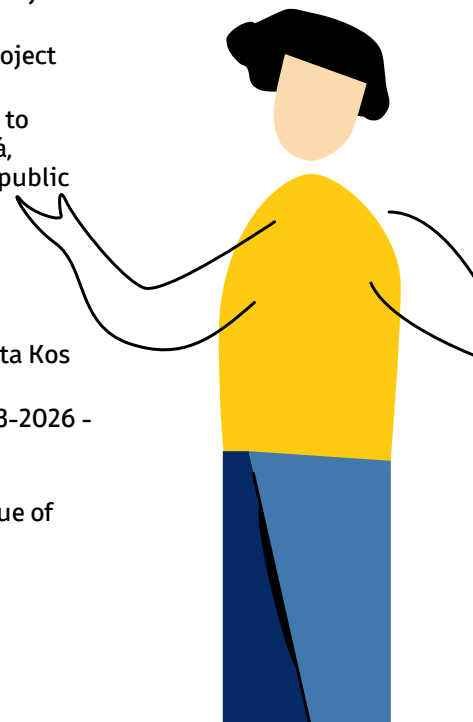

Speakers

Markéta Kos Mottlová is a PhD student at the Department of Political Science, Faculty of Arts, Charles University in Prague. Her publications focus on the concepts of political representation, women's political participation and gender quotas in politics. She works as an analyst at the non-profit organization Forum 50%. She is a member of the Government Council for Gender Equality and chairs the Committee for Equal Representation of Women and Men in Politics and Decision-Making Positions.

Nina Mazániková - she studied psychology combined with gender studies at Masaryk University in Brno and Gender Studies at Charles University in Prague. She works as a coordinator of promotional activities in the Independent Social Ecological Movement (NeseHnutí) and is a member of the F*ÉRA team there, focusing on work with young people, new media and educational policies.

Marta Musilová: Has a MA in Sociology (Faculty of Arts, Charles University). Currently, she works as a policy analyst in the areas of education, science, research, innovation and statistics at the Gender Equality Department of the Office of the Government of the Czech Republic. She is the co-author of the chapter Knowledge the Gender Equality Strategy for 2021 - 2030 (Strategy 2021+). Her other area of concern is monitoring and implementation of Strategy 2021+. She also organizes workshops on gender statistics and is a member of the Committee for Sustainable Development Indicators.

Josef Petr is the director of The League of Open Men. Josef studied sociology and civil society studies at the Charles University in Prague and has been working for the NGO sector for a long time in the field of management, PR and communication as well as research. Since 2006, he has been active in the League of Open Men (LOM). From 2018 as its director. LOM focuses on improving the quality of life of men in the Czech Republic. Its mission is to support men's active approach to personal development and health, to responsible partnership and parenthood, to self-realization and social engagement.

Anežka Prokopová studies MA in Gender Studies and works for NeseHnutí in F*ÉRA team where she organizes workshops and works with young people.

Jorge Salgado Simões: graduated in Geography with a MA in Sociology, Cities and Urban Cultures (Coimbra University). He is the Médio Tejo Intermunicipal Secretary for education, culture, sports and social issues, and in recent years has been involved in different projects concerning Erasmus+, Europe for Citizens and CERV programmes, mainly concerning Euroscepticism, democratic values and human rights promotion. He was a municipal department director for education and culture for 15 years in the Municipality of Torres Novas, Portugal.

Veronika Šprincová studied at the Faculty of Human Studies Charles University in Prague, the Department of Gender Studies Prague, where she also taught externally. Currently, she is the director of NGO called Fórum 50 % and for which she has been creating analyses and working as a lecturer since 2009. Her professional work focuses on gender equality, especially on women's representation in politics. From 2015 to 2019, she chaired the Gender Expert Chamber of the Czech Republic.

Malgorzata Wochowska - Doctor of Politics, senior project manager. Professionally, for over 10 years has coordinated big scale EU-funded projects in the fields of civil society engagement, EU active citizenship, Fundamental Rights, Gender Equality, and diverse types of networks of towns. She monitored and evaluated Horizon Europe projects for REA, and different calls under CERV Programm for EACEA. Activist and a co-founder of womens' rights organizations: Lodzkie Dziewuchy Dziewuchom (Gals4Gals Lodz) and the International Council of Polish Womxn
